

Women's Study Small Group Leaders Guide -Chapter 4

Our hope is that these questions would help guide your time together. Aim for an hour to an hour and a half of intentional conversation about the chapter, how each girl is doing personally and a time to pray for each person in your group.

Personal reflection questions:

How was your time in the Word this week?

Who are you seeking to share the gospel with and how is that going?

What is something God is teaching you either through the Word or in this book?

Book reflection questions:

What is something that challenged you in this chapter?

What is something that encouraged you?

You're talking about morality with an atheist student who says, "I believe at the base level all people are the same- we're just a bunch of atoms, cells, neurons and electrical impulses. No one person should consider him/herself better than someone else". What would you say to this?

Do you think Christians should be more active in human rights movements? Why or why not?

How can we look more to Christ as we seek to stand up for social justice?
